

Housing and homelessness policy in the COVID-19 pandemic and recession: crisis, innovation and building back better Chief Investigator: Prof. Hal Pawson

1. What is the research study about?

You are invited to take part in this research study. The research study aims to examine rapid policy changes in response to the COVID-19 emergency, regarding housing security and evictions, housing and income support payments, and homelessness. This survey asks about your experiences with rental negotiations in the COVID-19 emergency.

2. Who is conducting this research?

The study is being carried out by the following researchers: Prof. Hal Pawson, Dr Chris Martin, Dr Sian Thompson and Dr Alistair Sisson, City Futures Research Centre.

Research Funder: This research is being funded by Mission Australia, National Shelter and the UNSW-ACOSS Poverty and Inequality Partnership. The study runs in parallel with UK research led by the Collaborative Centre for Housing Evidence (CaCHE) at Glasgow University.

3. Inclusion/Exclusion Criteria

Before you decide to participate in this research study, we need to ensure that it is ok for you to take part. The research study is looking recruit people who meet the following criteria:

- Lived in a rented dwelling in Australia on 29 March 2020
- Are aged 18 or older

4. Do I have to take part in this research study?

Participation in any research study is voluntary. If you do not want to take part, you do not have to.

5. What does participation in this research require, and are there any risks involved?

If you decide to take part in the research study, we will ask you to read the information carefully (ask questions if necessary) and complete an online survey. The survey will ask questions about negotiations and changes in your rental arrangements during the COVID-19 emergency (since 29 March), and some background questions on you. It should take approximately 5-10 minutes to complete.

Reimbursement/Incentives: When you have completed the survey, you can enter your contact details to go into a prize draw for a \$500 gift voucher. The details you provide will only be used to contact you if your name is drawn.

6. What will happen to information about me?

Submission of the online questionnaire is an indication of your consent. By clicking the 'I agree, continue to survey' button you are providing your permission for the research team to collect and use the information you give for the purpose of the research study.

The research team will store the data collected from you for this research project for a minimum of 5 years after the publication of the research results or 7 years after the completion of the research, whichever is longer.

The information about you will be stored in a format that does not disclose your identity. Information collected from you in an electronic format will be stored on a UNSW password protected OneDrive only accessible to the approved research investigators.

Research publications will not disclose any identifying information. We will not share or disclose any identifying information except where required by law.

8. What if I want to withdraw from the research study?

If you do consent to participate, you may withdraw at any time. You can do this by closing the questionnaire. If you withdraw from the research, we will destroy any information that has already been collected. Once you have submitted the questionnaire however, we will not be able to withdraw your responses as the questionnaire is anonymous.

9. What if I have a complaint or any concerns about the research study?
